MGMA in Washington Year in Review

HELPING MEDICAL GROUPS REMAIN FINANCIALLY VIABLE

PREVENT ALMOST **10% IN CUTS** TO MEDICARE FROM TAKING EFFECT ON JAN. 1, 2022:

- Mitigated 3% of the -3.75% impact of the 2021 budget neutrality adjustment to the Medicare physician fee schedule conversion factor through CY 2022;
- Nullified the imposition of the 4% statutory pay-as-you-go sequester through CY 2022;
- Delayed the reinstatement of the existing 2% Medicare sequester; and,
- Delayed cuts to physician office laboratories and the next round of data reporting.

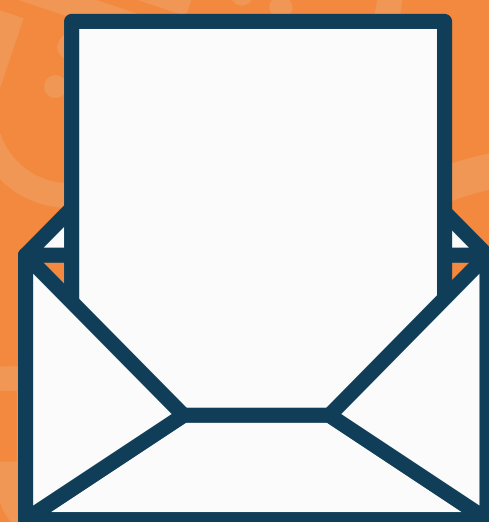


BILLIONS OF DOLLARS DISTRIBUTED FROM THE PROVIDER RELIEF FUND TO MEDICAL GROUPS

- ✓ Delayed AUC implementation for at least one year
- ✓ Successfully advocated for use of historical benchmarks for MIPS Quality measure performance for PY 2022
- ✓ Successfully advocated for delay of the implementation of the mandatory Radiation Oncology model
- ✓ Successfully advocated for the repeal of the Most Favored Nation mandatory drug pricing model
- ✓ Extended quality reporting via the CMS Web Inface for certain MIPS participants and for ACOs participating in MSSP
- ✓ Successfully advocated for extension of COVID-19 hardship flexibilities for the MIPS PY 2021
- ✓ Delayed implementation of Advanced Explanation of Benefit requirements as part of No Surprises Act
